

Key Stage 2 (End of Primary School) Results

2016 was the first year of the new tests and assessment procedures in maths and English. This year's tests are only the second to reflect the new primary curriculum, which was introduced in 2014. The Department for Education designed this new curriculum to be on a par with the best education systems in the world, and to give each child the best start in life. As this is only the second year of the new tests, the results will look very different from those of previous years, and should not be compared with them. This is because the Department for Education have introduced a new curriculum and set higher standards. It is true that in doing so they have raised the bar but this is because they want to match the best international standards worldwide.

2017 KEY STAGE 2 SATS RESULTS (*NATIONAL*)

- 61% of pupils met the new expected standard in reading, writing and mathematics
- 71% of pupils met the new expected standard in reading
- 75% of pupils met the new expected standard in mathematics
- 77% of pupils met the new expected standard in grammar, punctuation and spelling
- 76% of pupils met the new expected standard in writing

2017 KEY STAGE 2 SATS RESULTS (*NEWBARN*S)

- 53% of pupils met the new expected standard in reading, writing and mathematics
- 72% of pupils met the new expected standard in reading
- 60% of pupils met the new expected standard in mathematics
- 77% of pupils met the new expected standard in grammar, punctuation and spelling
- 78% of pupils met the new expected standard in writing

- Average Progress score in reading – 1.8, writing – 1.2, maths – -2.0
- Average scaled score in reading – 105, maths – 101
- 28% of children achieved a high level of attainment in reading
- 17% of children achieved a high level of attainment in writing
- 18% of children achieved a high level of attainment in maths
